FORWARD-ALL TOGETHER

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It is longer now the Manitoba farmer complains that he has nothing to say in the price which he receives for the product of his farm.

Operating in the Province since 1919 he has the Manitoba Co-operative Elevator with 2,510 member farmers, The Cattle Pool operating for two years with 5,000 Manitoba shippers, The Manitoba Co-operative Dairy, practically autonomous operating since 1911, now having 1,000 members, The Co-operative Wheat Elevator, seven years old, with 100 Manitoba shippers out of 1,000 shippers in Manitoba, The Wheat Pool with 5,310 members, requiring more to also handle other grains.

Every one of these co-operative organizations has been successful in getting the farmer more for the product which he has handled. They all need more volume in order that they may be able to give him still better service. We believe that the Wheat Pool Elevator will be a better co-operative, a better farmer and a better citizen if he markets his wheat, cattle, poultry, eggs and wool through his own organization. We have enough co-operative theory. Let's have more co-operative action.

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
