| Description:       | American Horse 'Wasechum Taschunka' (1840-1908). 'Wasechum<br>Taschunka' took on the name American Horse following the death of his<br>uncle ate the Battle of Slim Buttes. During the reservation days, he was<br>considered a notable progressive and became a head Oglala<br>spokesman. As an orator and diplomat, he represented his people in<br>numerous negotiations with the federal government. Following the<br>tragedy of Wounded Knee he became the leader of a unified Sioux<br>delegation which traveled to Washington seeking a more equitable<br>treatment for the Sioux. In his later years he traveled with Buffalo Bill and<br>the Wild West Show. (Harbaugh, P., 1982) |

| Description:       | Red Cloud 'Makpiya-luta'. As a non-hereditary chief, Red Cloud became<br>the most successful war leader of the Cheyenne and Sioux during the<br>1860's and the Indians' campaign to close the Bozeman Trail and keep<br>the Powder River inviolate. The Sioux were victorious and with the<br>signing of the Fort Laramic treaty in 1868 the army abandoned her forts<br>within the Dakota's hunting grounds. Thus Red Cloud became one of the<br>few Indians ever to win an armed conflict against the U.S. Army.<br>(Harbaugh, P., 1982) |

History /

Biographical:

The Berbank Red Cross was founded in November 1917, as a local feature of the Great War. The name Berbank was created by combining the names of the two local districts, Riverbank and Bertha, located south of Brandon in the Rural Municipality of Oakland. The Berbank Red Cross sent supplies of various kinds to local soldiers serving in the Canadian Expeditionary Force in Europe. The organization also organized social gatherings in the Berbank area. With the end of the war most rural Red Cross organizations were disbanded, but the Berbank group agreed to remain intact to assist with the construction of a church. (See accession 28-1997 Berbank Church fonds)

Custodial History:

This fonds was accessioned in 1997 by the McKee Archives. Prior custodial history is unknown.

Scope and Content:

Fonds includes a minute book, which provides a complete record of every meeting held by the Berbank Red Cross, from its creation in 1917 to 1919, when it became the Berbank Ladies Aid. Fonds also includes a roll call, financial records, and meeting minutes.

| Description:       | Young-Man-Afraid-of-his-Horses 'Tasunka Kokipapi' (c 1830-1900).<br>Although the hereditary Oglalachief, Man-Afraid yielded his tribal authority<br>to Red Cloud amid the turbulent years when the Sioux and Cheyenne<br>openly opposed the Boreman Trail and succeeded in their struggle to<br>drive the army from Sioux hunting grounds within the Powder River<br>country. He led his people on the warpath throughout the Red Cloud War<br>and during his later years was president of the Pine Ridge Council and<br>represented the Oglala in Washington on several occasions. (Harbaugh,<br>P., 1982) |
