History / Biographical:

This is an artificially created series consisting of blueprints generated by architects in the course of the construction of the principal structures on the campus of Brandon University.

Custodial History:

These records were in the possession of the Vice-president Administration and the Physical Plant Office prior to their transfer to the archives.

Scope and Content:

This series consisting of blueprints generated by architects in the course of the construction of the principal structures on the Brandon College campus (1899-1967) and the Brandon University campus since 1967. The blueprints are from three construction eras on the campus the records: 1900-1922; 1960-1972 and 1980 to 1996.

Notes: Nine blueprints created by the Kewaunee Manufacturing Company,

Wisconsin containing plans for various laboratories and domestic science facilities were culled from the collection of blueprints. There is no specific reference to Brandon College on the blueprints. No evidence exists in the administrative records of Brandon College that laboratory

equipment or furniture was acquired from this company.
