

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Dr. J. "Roby" Kidd Commencement Speaker

On Friday, May 25 some fifty students will receive degrees in Arts or Science, and some twenty will receive high school teaching certificates at the Brandon College Commencement Exercises.

Dr. J. 'Roby" Kidd of Ottawa, who will deliver the Commencement address, is Secretary-Treasurer of the Humanities Research Council of Canada and of the Social Science Research Council of Canada. Previously Executive Director of the Canadian Association for Adult Education, Dr. Kidd succeeded Dr. Robbins in these offices when the latter became President of Brandon College.

Dr. Kidd is internationally known for the offices he has held in the field of Adult Education. He appears frequently on the radio and television and has lectured in many parts of North America, the Caribbean, Europe and Asia. He is the author of numerous books and reports.

Proposed Constitutional Amendments

Following are proposed constitutional amendments approved by the Alumni executive, to be presented to the Annual Meeting for a vote by the general membership:

Article V

(A) (3) that the word "Associate" be inserted before 'Editor of the Alumni News", the clause then reading, 'The Executive Board shall consist of the officers of the Association, the past president, the chairmen on standing committees and the Associate Editor of the 'Brandon College Alumni News'."

Article V

(A) (4) (e) that the following be added after the word "correspondence": "edit the Alumni News", the clause then reading: "The General Secretary shall keep minutes of all meetings of the Association and of the Executive Board, take care of all correspondence and press releases, edit the Alumni News, send out notices of meetings and perform such other duties as may be recommended by the Executive Board.

Article V

(I) that the words 'the third Monday of every month" be replaced by "once a month, on a regular day (to be arranged at the beginning of each year)", the clause then reading: "The Executive Board shall hold meetings once a month on a regular day (to be arranged at the beginning of each year), excluding July and August, and at the call of the President or any two Executive members."

Re-organization Brings New Registrar

In face of expanding enrolment and facilities, the dual position of Registrar-Bursar formerly held by D.R. MacKay '40 will, as of August 1, comprise two positions requiring two separate offices.

The new Registrar will be Prof. Norma E. Walmsley, associate professor of Political Science. During her seven years at Brandon College, Miss Walmsley's academic contribution has been supplemented by administrative work, done in connection with the establishment of the new library, reorganization of the scholarship program and student counselling. Miss Walmsley will continue as Head of the Political Science Department, with a new appointment to carry some of the courses. Her Assistant Registrar will be Nancy Small '50, who has been teaching in the Commercial Department of Neepawa Collegiate for the past three years.

Mr. MacKay will carry on as Bursar of the College, a position which involves a greatly increased role, in view of the College expansion activities.
